Yearbook

Treasurer: (1 person)

- ◆ Documents yearbook sales
- ◆ Helps deposit money
- ◆ Signs off on withdrawals (no **cash!**) spent to make the yearbook
- ◆ Provide input on yearbook design

Photographers: (2-3 people)

- Helps to have your own camera/phone
- ◆ Help to take candid pictures of 6-8 students throughout the school year at 6-8 events
 - ◆ Help Mrs. Stehler and Mrs. Besio keep track of upcoming games and events
 - ◆ Provide input on yearbook design

Graphic Design: (3-4 people)

- ◆ Help with choosing cover, page backgrounds and page layouts

JRHS Science Olympiad

- ◆ Science Olympiad functions like a school sport
- ◆ Requires preparation, commitment, coaching and practice throughout the year
- ◆ Like an academic track meet—Team of 15 students compete in 25 events that are Science/Engineering based
